News from City Hall

City/School Elections

The regular city/school election will be held on November 7, 2023. The filing period for the city/school election candidates will begin on Monday, August 28, 2023 and will close on Thursday, September 21, 2023 at 5:00pm. Nomination papers must be filed with the Dallas County Auditor during the filing period. They cannot be filed before or after the filling period.

The City of Van Meter has 4 positions to fill this election cycle: three (3) council seats and the Mayor's position. All candidates must be residents of the City of Van Meter. All candidates for City vacancies must complete and submit an Affidavit of Candidacy and nomination petition with at least 10 signatures to the Dallas County Auditor by the deadline.

The Van Meter School Board has 2 seats up for election this year. Please contact the school for more information.

August 2023 Newsletter Reduce Reuse RECYCLE for Health

From the air we breathe to the water we drink, the environments we live in contribute to our health and well-being. When we take care of our environment, we are benefiting both the earth and the health of our communities.

The environmental health team at Dallas County Health Department manages the rural recycling program. This program was created to make recycling accessible for Dallas County residents that

reside outside of a city's limits.

Rural recycling is single stream. That means that items appropriate for recycling do not need to be separated in the green recycling bins. When items that are not appropriate for recycling are included, like food waste or hazardous materials, it contaminates the bin and costs the county taxpayers extra fees to remove the contamination.

We ask that residents that utilize the rural recycling program are careful recycling non-recyclable items.

Gray bins are also located at each of the rural recycling locations. These "cardboard only" bins are available for use by any Dallas County resident.

Recycling reduces the amount of waste that goes into the landfill, conserves natural resources and prevents areenhouse qas emissions created by manufacturing materials. By working together as a community, we can reduce, reuse, and recycle to maintain a healthy environment in which all of us can live.

East Street Underpass Repairs

The Van Meter City Council will meet on August 2, 2023 to review and approve a bid from I-80 Concrete authorizing repairs to the East Street underpass – or better known as the school pedestrian walkway. Weather permitting, the repairs will be completed before school resumes on August 23, 2023.



With students and staff heading back to school on August 23, we are encouraging parents, students, staff and residents to allow extra time for travel, to be patient and pay close attention to their surroundings.

Code Enforcement

As a reminder, the City of Van Meter recently contracted with Iowa Code Enforcement to perform the duties of the Code Enforcement Office for the City. Cities must manage nuisance properties in their community. Nuisance properties can be hazardous to others, cause property values to decline and/or create a poor image of the community. The City of Van Meter Code of Ordinances provides more detail about what is considered a nuisance.

Code Enforcement applies to all properties: residential, non-residential & commercial properties. The Code Enforcement Officer will inspect and take pictures of properties in violation of the City Code through pro-active inspections and follow-up with local complaints.





News from Public Works

WATER

Effective July 1, the residential (inside the City of Van Meter) water rate will increase to \$25.80 for the first 2,000 gallons used per month and \$5.88 per 1,000 gallons over 2,000 gallons. The non-resident (outside the City of Van Meter) water rate will increase to \$82.20 for the first 2,000 gallons used per month and \$18.75 per 1,000 gallons over 2,000 gallons.

SEWER

Effective July 1, the residential (inside the City of Van Meter) sewer rate will increase to \$25.51 for the first 2,000 gallons used per month and \$7.49 per 1,000 gallons over 2,000 gallons. The non-resident (outside the City of Van Meter) sewer rate will increase to \$77.53 for the first 2,000 gallons used per month and \$22.78 per 1,000 gallons over 2,000 gallons.

The new rates are reflected on the bill included with this newsletter.

SUGGESTED LAWN WATERING


Van Meter Public Works wants to remind residents to use water wisely. By improving the efficiency of irrigation practices, businesses and homeowners can reduce consumption, save money and reduce the peak load on water facilities.

Watering is not recommended on Mondays.

Even-numbered addresses are encouraged to water on Sundays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, before 10:00am or after 5:00pm.



Odd-numbered addresses are encouraged to water on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, before 10:00am or after 5:00pm.





News from the Police Department

In 2022, 55% of traffic fatalities in lowa were unbelted or unknown. So far, in 2023 that number is about 60%. It is perceived everyone wears a seat belt, yet over half of our fatalities are unrestrained. This translates to 100's of lives lost over the last few years.

If you know a friend or a family member who does not buckle up, please talk to them about changing their habits. Help GTSB and our law enforcement partners spread this lifesaving message before one more friend or family member is killed. Seat belts save lives, and everyone – front seat and back, child and adult – needs to buckle up.


